

## GUIDED HUNT EQUIPMENT LIST

Anyone born after January 1, 1975 is required to have a hunter safety course.

Tags and Licenses (if we purchased them they will be at the trailhead.)

Rifle sighted at 200 yd. Big enough to kill an elk. Preferable 30+ cal.

Clothing: Hunter orange in Idaho is optional  
Warm head gear, Gloves,  
Belt and or suspenders (optional)  
Rain suit, raincoat, or slicker  
2 pair boots, water proof or packs  
Warm coat, jacket, and or sweater  
(Remember dressing in layers is better)  
4 shirts, 4 T- shirts, 3 pair of pants (Wool is warmer)  
8 pairs of socks, 2 pair of long johns and under clothing

### EQUIPMENT

A warm sleeping bag. (-20° below rating)

THE FIRES GO OUT AT NIGHT; WE RE-LIGHT THE FIRE IN THE MORNING BEFORE YOU GET UP.

Good pair Binoculars

(Rifle scope is for putting on a target you intend on taking)

Flash Light or head lamp (easy to pack) Extra Batteries

Water Bottle

Bullets, 40 rounds

Use proven round that will hold together when they hit.

A pocketknife or a belt knife

Daypack or Fanny packs (5# heavier than rifle, to counter balance rifle on saddle.)

Waterproof matches and some kind of fire starter

Compass,

G.P.S., Camera, film (optional)

Pistol (optional)

### Shaving kit items

Ear Plugs

Tooth brush, toothpaste, and floss

Comb or hairbrush etc.

Shampoo, soap,

Bath towel, wash cloth,

Sunglasses

Extra pair of eyeglasses

Prescription medicine
